

Small Property Clean Up Resources

11/17/2020-The Oregon Department of Transportation, which has experience with major infrastructure projects, will take the lead on the debris cleanup program.

“Our mission is to safely clear the ash and debris as quickly as possible, and leave Oregonians with a clean site so they can rebuild,” said Kris Strickler, director of the Oregon Department of Transportation.

Property owners need to sign a right-of-entry form to allow cleanup crews onto their property. Cleanup crews will remove ash and structural debris, hazard trees, concrete foundations and burned vehicles.

Also on Monday, FEMA announced that the deadline for survivors of Oregon wildfires to apply for FEMA individual disaster assistance and low-interest disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration was extended to Nov. 30.

The assistance can include money for rental assistance, essential home repairs, personal property losses, and other serious disaster-related needs not covered by insurance.
